What has the CADE project achieved?...

The CADE project is part of the development of the North East Voluntary and Community Sector (VCS) Equalities Coalition. It received £769,716.00 through One NorthEast's Single Programme funding, from 2006 – 2009.

This is a short summary of the final independent Vision Sense evaluation report for the CADE project. We want to share what has worked with funders, the Coalition, its members and other projects.

The project aimed to work closely with people at risk of exclusion through discrimination and with the community groups that work with older people, young people, people from Black and Minority Ethnic communities, disabled people, lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans gender people and people of different faith groups. It wanted to build their capacity and provide a focus to promote equality in the region.
