Reach Out 2010

Rising Star project was initiated during 2006-07 as a pilot project under PCS educational programme with future aim of setting up long term educational programme in the name of "Reach Out 2010".

After the success of Rising Star, the Society decided to extend the course of this project until 2010 as part of its Educational Programme. An opportunity to engage young people to develop their artistic skills through innovative workshops and training sessions.

As part of this programme, PCS has successfully identified key areas of development through discussions, consultations with younger generation groups to encourage their interest and focus to participate in dramatics and literature aided projects.

Over the past one year, through substantial amount of interaction and development work that PCS has undertaken, it will help identify the information gaps that exists in understanding defined areas of arts development from British Asian perspective with emphasis on South Asian arts.

Waqt is a new dance production choreographed and directed by Gauri Sharma Tripathi. One of the world's leading exponents of Kathak. Gauri has studied folk styles in India. She has incorporated other dance influences within her classic framework. She has appeared as choreographer and performer in Munich Biennle, Royal Festival Hall, Westminster Abbey and Buckingham Palace. Trained in the traditions of the Kathak dance Gauri has given her own joyous personality, creating a style of her own. Gauri has made various dance festivals performing in India, Europe, UK, and North America.



She has also appeared as a choreographer and performer in most of the major venues in India and the UK.

Gauri's recent work includes:

- Choreographing and developing Mahabharata
- Assisting to choreographing West End musical Far Pavilions.

On the 25th May PCS was honoured in presenting Waqt in association with Gem Arts at Dance City. With such prestigious performer performing there was a turn out of about 175 people who thoroughly enjoyed this dancer at what she is known best at.

Sahelian ~ Well-being project



On the 25th April 2007 the Pakistan Cultural society officially launched its new project *Sahelian* (meaning Friends) dedicated to the well being of woman through informative awareness of health and artistic agendas.

The launch took place at the new PCS hall where exclusively large group of about 70 women turned out to join the inauguration event. The main purposes of the launch was to find out interests, ideas and aspirations and to bring together women from various different ethnic backgrounds and

enlighten them with information.

Sahelian project was officially flagged off with a warm hearted speech from Mrs. Shammi, Board member of PCS welcoming the women and giving an outline about PCS and its objectives for Sahelian and informing those who were not familiar with its purpose and programmes.

Dr. Bansal of Sangini – BME Women's Lead organisation-Sunderland shared their experiences on behalf of Sangini to give an overview about their successful journey during the past five years as a case study which could inspire this new group.

The project will promote awareness of women related health issues i.e., Diabetes, Arthritis and other specific women related illnesses by inviting distinguished medical professionals to give preventive measures and treatment advices for physical and mental wellbeing of women.

Apart from the medical awareness issues, the project will also organise activities like Yoga, Dance, Singing, Poetry, Cookery and even Dramatics, which should bring about more participation and expression of their individual specialities they would like to share and learn from others.

The project is themed to create a fusion of activities utilizing arts and health awareness with target end results beneficial to women in a package.
